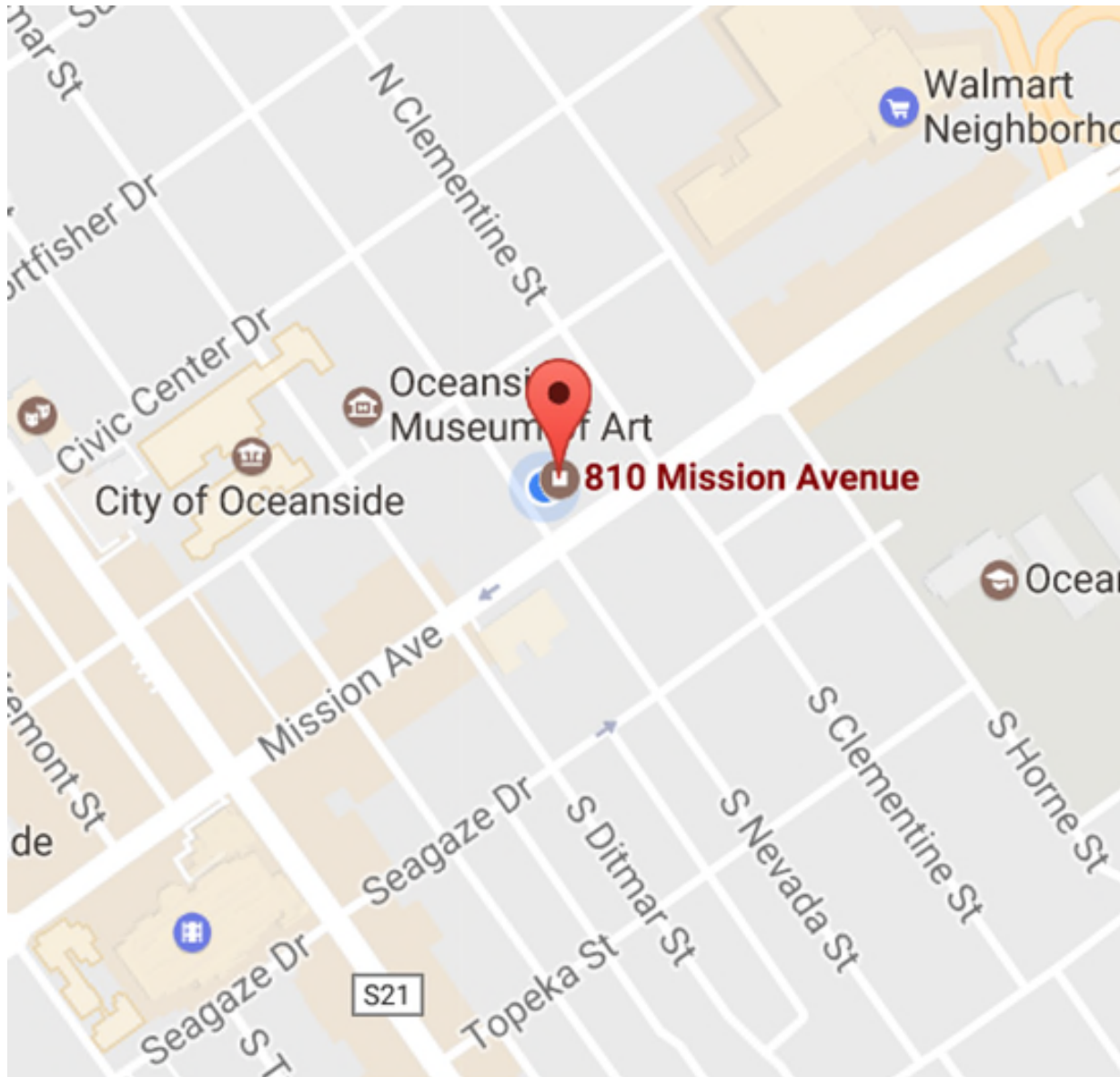

## **Rules for Public Speakers at Meetings of the North County Transit District**

Per Board policy, all public communications at meetings of the North County Transit District shall be made and received in accordance with the following procedures except where modified and/or temporarily superseded with COVID-19 protocols as provided in the **COVID-19 PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT AND SPECIAL PROCEDURES** provided in this agenda.

### **1. TELEPHONIC COMMENTS NOT ON AGENDA**

- A. Total time limit for telephonic comments:
  - Beginning of meeting: Fifteen (15) minutes
  - End of meeting: No time limit.
- B. Time limit per speaker per meeting: Three (3) minutes, with no donation of time allowed.
- C. Priority: First come, first served. Telephonic comments will be played for the Board of Directors in the order they were received.
- D. Order on agenda: Items will be heard at the beginning of the meeting and if the time limit stated in Paragraph A is exhausted, telephonic comments that were not allowed to be played for the Board of Directors at the beginning of the meeting due to time limit stated above, will be played at the end of the meeting. under “*Remaining Public Communications.*”

### **2. TIME LIMITS FOR ADDRESSING MATTERS ON THE AGENDA**

- A. Total time limit: None.
- B. Time limit per speaker: Three (3) minutes, with one donation of three minutes, for a maximum of six minutes.
- C. These rules apply to both public hearing and non-public hearing items listed on the agenda.
- D. Comments made not germane to the subject matter of the agenda item being considered are out of order.

### **3. CUTOFF FOR TURNING IN SPEAKER SLIPS**

- A. All timely received telephonic comments will be shared with the Board of Directors during the meeting. The deadline to leave a telephonic comment is 12:00 p.m. on the meeting day.

### **4. MODIFICATION OF RULES BY CHAIR**

- A. The Board Chair may, in his or her absolute discretion, relax the requirements of these rules. However, a decision of the Chair to do so in one instance shall not be deemed a waiver of the rules as to any other instance or matter.

## Quorum and Voting

Pursuant to Public Utilities Code § 125102, a majority of the Board members eligible to vote shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and all official acts of the Board shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Board eligible to vote; however, after a vote of the members is taken, a weighted vote may be called by any two members eligible to vote.

In the case of a weighted vote, the County of San Diego and each city (with exception of the City of San Diego), shall, in total, exercise 100 votes to be apportioned annually based on population. Approval under the weighted vote procedure requires the vote of the representatives of not less than three jurisdictions representing not less than 51 percent of the total weighted vote to supersede the original action of the Board. When a weighted vote is taken on any item that requires more than a majority vote of the Board members eligible to vote, it shall also require the supermajority percentage of the weighted vote. County population: The population of the County of San Diego shall be the population in the unincorporated area of the county within the area of jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to Public Utilities Code § 125052.

RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Board of Directors adopt one of the two (2) alternatives:

- 1) Adopt Resolution No. 22-01 proclaiming a local emergency, re-ratifying the proclamation of a state of emergency and re-authorizing remote teleconference meetings of the legislative bodies of the North County Transit District in compliance with Assembly Bill 361 effective January 7, 2022 through January 20, 2022; or
- 2) Resume in-person meetings effective January 7, 2022.

**BACKGROUND  
INFORMATION:**

On September 30, 2021, the North County Transit District's (NCTD) Board of Directors (Board) adopted Resolution No. 21-04, A Resolution of the Board of Directors of the North County Transit District Proclaiming a Local Emergency. Ratifying the Proclamation of a State Emergency on March 4, 2020, and by Executive Order N-15-21 and Executive Order N-08-21 and Authorizing Remote Teleconference Meetings of the Legislative Bodies of the North County Transit District in Compliance with Assembly Bill 361, Adopted September 16, 2021, and Pursuant to Brown Act Provisions (Agenda Item No. 1).

Pursuant to the provisions in Assembly Bill 361, NCTD must adopt subsequent resolutions to continue the use of remote teleconference meetings for NCTD's legislative bodies. Resolution No. 22-01 re-authorizes the use of remote teleconference meetings until the earlier of January 20, 2022, or such time as the Board adopts a subsequent finding in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953 of the Government Code.

On January 5, 2022 the Governor issued Executive Order N-1-22 extending the state of emergency due to the Omicron variant and stating the following:

*WHEREAS since Thanksgiving, the statewide seven-day average case rate has increased by 805% and the number of COVID-19 hospitalized patients has increased by 154%; and*

*WHEREAS this surge is being driven by the recent emergence of the Omicron variant, which has recently been estimated to account for approximately 70% of cases sequenced nationally; and*

*WHEREAS early data suggest that the Omicron variant is more transmissible than the Delta variant;*

This Executive Order is further evidence in support of virtual meetings and the status of the state's position.

Staff has prepared Resolution No. 22-01 should the Board elect to adopt the finding re-authorizing the use of remote teleconference meetings.

**RESOLUTION NO. 22-01**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF  
THE NORTH COUNTY TRANSIT DISTRICT PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY,  
RE-RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY ON  
MARCH 4, 2020, AND BY EXECUTIVE ORDER N-15-21 AND EXECUTIVE ORDER  
N-08-21, AND RE-AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF  
THE LEGISLATIVE BODIES OF NORTH COUNTY TRANSIT DISTRICT  
FOR THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 7, 2022 to JANUARY 20, 2022  
PURSUANT TO BROWN ACT PROVISIONS.**

**WHEREAS**, the North County Transit District is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

**WHEREAS**, all meetings of North County Transit District's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code Sections 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the District's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors previously adopted Resolution Number 21-04 on September 30, 2021, finding that the requisite conditions exist for the legislative bodies of the North County Transit District to conduct remote teleconference meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953; and

**WHEREAS**, as a condition of extending the use of the provisions found in section 54953(e), the Board of Directors must reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency that exists in the District, and the Board of Directors has done so; and

**WHEREAS**, emergency conditions persist in the District, specifically, a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

**WHEREAS**, state and/or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the state of emergency, and, social distancing orders has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District, and desires to affirm a local emergency exists and re-ratify the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State

of California and ratify the Health and Human Services Agency issued State Public Health Officer Order; and

**WHEREAS**, as a consequence of the local emergency persisting, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the legislative bodies of the North County Transit District shall continue to conduct their meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall continue to comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and

**WHEREAS**, the North County Transit District has taken the following measures to ensure public access to the District's Regular, Special, and Committee Meetings:

- Written public comments may be submitted to the District,
- Telephonic comments may be submitted to the District ahead of a scheduled meeting, and
- A live public participation option will be provided to the public and detailed on the cover page of the District's Agenda Packet.

WHEREAS On January 5, 2022 the Governor issued Executive Order N-1-22 extending the state of emergency due to the Omicron variant and stating the following:

WHEREAS since Thanksgiving, the statewide seven-day average case rate has increased by 805% and the number of COVID-19 hospitalized patients has increased by 154%; and

WHEREAS this surge is being driven by the recent emergence of the Omicron variant, which has recently been estimated to account for approximately 70% of cases sequenced nationally; and

WHEREAS early data suggest that the Omicron variant is more transmissible than the Delta variant.;

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE NORTH COUNTY TRANSIT DISTRICT DOES HEREBY FIND AND RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

**Section 2.** Affirmation that Local Emergency Persists. The Board of Directors hereby considers the conditions of the state of emergency in the District and proclaims that a local emergency persists throughout the District, and The State of California Health and Human Services Agency has issued State Public Health Officer Order of June 11, 2021 and the San Diego County Order Of The Health Officer (effective June 15, 2021) imposing face covering and isolation requirements and recommending social distancing measures.

**Section 3.** Re-ratification of Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency. The Board hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date.

**Section 4.** Remote Teleconference Meetings. The Executive Director and its designee(s) and legislative bodies of North County Transit District are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

**Section 5.** Effective Date of Resolution. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of January 20th, 2022, or such time as the Board of Directors adopts a subsequent finding in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the North County Transit District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953 of the Government Code. Nothing herein requires the Board of Directors to act to extend the term of this Resolution if the Governor of the State issues an Executive Order suspending any or all of the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act to allow legislative bodies to conduct public meetings without strict compliance with the teleconferencing provisions of the Brown Act.

# Assembly Bill 361

- **A local agency may use teleconferencing without complying with certain requirements of the Brown Act such as posting an agenda at every location where a Board member is participating from, so long as the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and:**
  - state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; and
  - for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; and
  - has determined, by majority vote, that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.
- **Board is required to assert continuing findings every 30 days should it wish to continue holding meetings virtually**



# COVID-19 Case Rates

- **Nationally – 176 per 100,000 (7-day average) as of January 6, 2022. This is a 14-day increase of 247%**
- **State – 88.7 new cases per 100,000 (7-day average with a 7-day lag) as of January 5, 2022**
- **County – 66.6 per 100,000 (7-day average with a 7-day lag) as of January 5, 2022**
- **NCTD – 27 positive cases total for the pandemic. 7 cases (26%) since December 20, 2021**





# Meeting Alternatives

## The Board of Directors is asked to adopt one of the two alternatives:

- (1) Adopt Resolution No. 22-01 proclaiming a local emergency, re-ratifying the proclamation of a state of emergency and re-authorizing remote teleconference meetings of the legislative bodies of the North County Transit District in compliance with Assembly Bill 361 effective January 7, 2022 through January 20, 2022; or
- (2) Resume in person meetings effective January 7, 2022



# Staff Safety Protocol Recommendations for In-Person Meetings

- **Board Members and Staff – Face coverings required indoors**
- **Members of the Public – Face coverings required indoors:**
  - Signs will be placed to inform the public that face coverings are required
  - Security will be in attendance (as in the past) to ensure security and to assist with crowd control, if needed
  - Extra cleaning protocols will be in place (i.e., podium cleaning between speakers, door handles, etc.)
  - Masks will be available and handed out to anyone not wearing a face covering



# AB 361 Impacts on Local Agency Compliance with the Brown Act

## Brown Act Requirement

The agency shall post agendas at all teleconference locations.

Each teleconference location shall be identified in the notice and agenda of the meeting or proceeding, and each teleconference location shall be accessible to the public.

## Requirement under AB 361

- Agendas are not required to be posted at all teleconference locations.
- Agendas are not required to identify each teleconference location in the meeting notice/agenda.
- Local agencies are not required to make each teleconference location accessible to the public.



# AB 361 Impacts on Local Agency Compliance with the Brown Act

## Brown Act Requirement

During the teleconferenced meeting, at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body shall participate from locations within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction.

## Requirement under AB 361

No requirement to have a quorum of Board members participate from within the territorial bounds of the local agency's jurisdiction.



# AB 361 Impacts on Local Agency Compliance with the Brown Act

## Brown Act Requirement

The agenda shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to address the legislative body directly at each teleconference location.

## Requirement under AB 361

- The agenda shall identify and include an opportunity for all persons to attend via a call-in option or an internet-based service option
- Written/remote public comment must be accepted until the point at which the public comment period is formally closed; registration/sign-up to provide/be recognized to provide public comment can only be closed when the public comment period is formally closed.
